## CONDITION

The various gradings of stamps are, in order; superb, extremely fine, very fine, fine. In the case of sets, large blocks, sheets, etc., the condition quoted represents the average, and quality above and below this standard can be expected.
Mixed Condition: In large lots, the condition is generally expected to range from fair to at best fine. Serious defects can be expected.
Handstamp on reverse: Denotes either a dealer, collector or indecipherable expert's mark.

A formative piece. William George Fargo is a founder of American Express Company and the cofounder of Wells Fargo. He served as the 27th Mayor of Buffalo from 1862 until 1866 during the U.S. Civil War.

Autograph; Roebling, John A: "The Bridge Builder" Designer of the Brooklyn Bridge (finished by his son) along with numerous other bridges, signed and written in 1849, the same year he was building the Roebling's Delaware Aqueduct (the Roebling Bridge). This is the oldest existing wire suspension bridge in the United States. The bridge runs 535 feet (163 meters) over the Delaware River, from Minisink Ford, New York, to Lackawaxen, Pennsylvania. Opened in 1849 as an aqueduct connecting two parts of the Delaware \& Hudson Canal. The letter written to Mr. Lot Clark a NY State politician and former District attorney of Chenango County in Lock Port NY, bears a manuscript "10 Saxebberg P Feb 24 " and references some specifications and a price of $\$ 3000$ and poor workmanship on the prior construction. A true hands on letter.

Colonial: Used to Great Britain; 1761 NEW YORK two-line in browish red in folded letter sheet to London., date lined "Sept 191761 and noted to be read at committee on "Jan 11, 1762", the committee was the "Propagation of the Gospel," and the writer is likely Samuel Albright, who served as the reverend for Trinity Church. On the reverse, decent strike of London "II DE" Bishop’s mark. A wonderful handwritten and ecclesiastical addressee. $\qquad$ .Est. Cash Val.
"The Society for Propagating the Gospel Among the Indians and Others in North America" was the first Protestant missionary organization of its kind in North America. It existed in concept prior to its 1787 charter as a group of Boston individuals sponsoring missionary work in New England.

Oliver Wolcott, jr. was a Connecticut-based politician. Educated at Yale University and with a degree in law from Litchfield Law School. He served in the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War as an aide-de-camp for his father. He became the first auditor of the federal treasury in 1789, in 1795 he was the comptroller of the Treasury Department later that year, Secretary of the Treasury under President George Washington. In 1802, he formed Oliver Wolcott \& Company, an import-export firm. Wolcott established Bank of America in 1811, working there until 1814.

In 1817 he was elected governor of Connecticut and served ten consecutive one-year terms. He died in New York City on June 1, 1833.

The Pullman rail strike in Illinois cut off all rail service west of Detroit, leaving California train-less and mail-less. In July of 1894 in response to the strike, Arthur Banta owner of the Victor Cyclery store in Fresno, organized a 210-mile bicycle route which would carry a letter from Fresno to San Francisco for 25 cents. Banta used Eugene Donze, of the engraver of the die. Donze was not known for his aptitude in spelling and the first plate spelled "San Fransisco" with an " S". This plateamong other changes, corrects the " $s$ " to a " $c$ " as shown in this example. The route ended at the conclusion of the Pullman Strike. This is a fascinating story.

A heart-wrenching letter from prisoner's wife talking about their young children, her worry and lonesomeness. Stalag Luft \#1 was located on the Baltic Sea just outside Barth, Germany about 105 miles northwest of Berlin. The camp began to receive American fliers in 1943. More than 7700 American prisoners and 1400 British prisoners spent time at this POW camp. On May 1, 1945, just over 3 weeks after the prisoner's wife mailed this letter, with Russian soldiers advancing, the Germans abandoned thecamp. The Russians took over the camp for about two weeks when American troops arrived and they released the prisoners.

The envelope was sent to Java, the addressee could not be located and the envelope was returned to the sender two months later. While it is hard to determine when the envelope was damaged during transit and needed the official seals, the seals appear to have been added in Philadelphia on January 27, 1939 based on the seals covering the oval New York January 26 handstamps but clearly being tied by the Philadelphia January 27, 1939 handstamps. The damage to the envelope is a strong indication thatthe envelope had enclosures of some weight. The weight of the envelope was likely between 3-3½ ounces paying 7- times the 704 rate per ounce Trans-Pacific air mail rate (FAM to Hong King and beyond by air) with the 154 registry fee resulting in a 5-cen t overpayment.

This is the only recorded commercial usage of a single \$5 Presidential used on an envelope to a foreign country that we have seen. Obviously a significant part of United States 20th Century Postal History

## REPRODUCTIONS \& FORGERIES <br> SPERATIS - NEWFOUNDLAND

The Carl Walske Collection of Sperati Newfoundland Reproductions, Sperati reproduced all six denominations of the 1857/1860 issues. The "reproductions" exist in a range of shades approximating both the scarlet vermilion and the orange vermilion of the genuine issues. They will be differentiated here by denomination only, not color and year.

## Introduction

The following 29 lots of Newfoundland, by the master Jean de Sperati all are from the Carl Walske collection, many of them bought directly from the daughter of Sperati (these are unmarked on the reverse)and all were printed in small numbers. Most are listed in the 1955 British Philatelic Association publication, "The Work of Jean De Sperati" referenced as "Sperati I", but some later discoveries are listed in "The Work of Jean de Sperati II", including previously unlisted Forgeries by Robson Lowe and Carl Walske.

CAYMAN ISLANDS: 1803; Earliest Known Folded Letter from the Cayman Islands, Dateline
"Aeolus" off the Caymans September 10, 1803, on a folded letter sheet addressed, and written by Captain Andrew F. Evans to Captain Grindall of the H.M. Ship "Prince", in Plymouth, England. Grindall rose to Rear Admiral after Trafalgar and served on the second voyage of Captain Cook. "3/6" ms rate crossed out and re-rated "3/-", faint New York oval transit postmark and Plymouth mileage handstamp on reverse. The outer part of the cover has some soiling and light staining plus edge faults, typical of letters of this period. The entire letter has been transcribed, and the letter placed in an archival skin for preservation.

The contents of the letter relates information about the death of officer, Lieutenant Thomas Livesely, who was the protégé of Captain Grindall. The almost three page letter describes how the Lt. contracted an illness referred to as "fever of the West Indies", which today is believed to be yellow fever. The primary purpose of the letter is to distribute the prize money and wages due to the deceased.Ex Green, Maisel.

The "Aeolus" was built in 1783 at Åbenrå in Denmark as a West Indiaman. Captain Evans served briefly as the Captain from May 1803 to May 1804. The British Royal Navy captured the ship in 1807, and it was purchased by Buckle \& Co.in 1808-9 she was a transport ship for convicts to Port Jackson, New South Wales. There was no regular postal service in the Cayman Islands prior to 1889. Very few stampless covers exist from this period. Of those that are known, most are in museums or similarly not available to collectors. There are believed to be seven or eight letters in the Methodist Society archives in London. The cover here offered is the earliest known from the Cayman Islands and is believed to be one of only two such pre-adhesive letters that still remain in private hands. A great rarity!
